



JUST JESUS: A Journey Through Mark PART 16 - Mark 5:21-34

Crossing Over for the One

READ: Mark 5:21–24 and Luke 15:1–7

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 1) Pastor G's message highlighted Jesus' deliberate "crossing over" into both Gentile and Jewish spaces. What does this say about His mission and His priorities?
- 2) Jairus risks everything—status, reputation, tradition—to fall at Jesus' feet. When have you felt desperate enough to throw your pride aside like that?
- 3) Why do you think Jesus was so responsive to Jairus, without hesitation, despite the risks of uncleanness?
- 4) What areas of your life are you still trying to handle "respectably" instead of bringing them honestly to Jesus in desperation?

Reaching in Secret, Risking it All

READ: Mark 5:25–28 and Romans 10:17

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 1) Pastor G described this woman's condition as not just physical, but emotional, financial, and social. Which part of her suffering stands out most to you?
- 2) She believed healing could come from just touching Jesus' cloak. What does that teach us about the kind of faith Jesus honors?
- 3) Greg called her faith both "courageous" and "scandalous." What do you think that kind of faith looks like today?
- 4) Who around you might be silently reaching out for Jesus? How can your story, your testimony, help awaken someone else's faith?

Power That Flows, Love That Stops

READ: Mark 5:29–32 and Luke 6:19

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 1) Pastor Greg shared that this was the first time in the Gospel of Mark that someone is healed before Jesus even speaks. What does that show us about how faith and divine power intersect?
- 2) Why do you think Jesus stops everything to find out who touched Him—even though the healing already happened?
- 3) In a culture where many people feel unseen or anonymous, how can we be more like Jesus—stopping, noticing, and calling out faith?
- 4) When have you felt the Spirit of God move in a way that felt deeply personal, even in a crowd?

From Unclean to Beloved

READ: Mark 5:33–34 and 2 Corinthians 6:18

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 1) Jesus calls this woman "Daughter"—the only time He uses that word directly. Why is that so powerful in this moment?
- 2) Pastor Greg talked about how Jesus not only heals her physically but restores her relationally. How does that reshape our view of what healing means?

3) Jesus tells her, "Your faith has saved you... go into peace... remain healed." What do those three statements mean to you personally?

4) What areas of your life still need that word—Daughter, Son—spoken over them? Where do you still need to go into peace?
