# JUST JESUS: A Journey Through Mark ~ Part 21

Immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go ahead of Him to the other side to Bethsaida, while He Himself was sending the crowd away. After bidding them farewell, He left for the mountain to <u>pray</u>. ~ Mark 6:45-46 (NASB 1995)

So Jesus, perceiving that they were intending to come and take Him by force to make Him king, withdrew again to the mountain by Himself alone. ~ John 6:15 (NASB 1995)

PROS - GREEK ~ toward or in the direction of

**EUCHOMAI - GREEK** ~ to speak, wish, or vow

<u>PROSEUCHOMAI - GREEK</u> ~ to direct one's wishes or vows toward someone, to pray

When it was evening, the boat was in the middle of the sea, and He was alone on the land. Seeing them <u>straining at the oars</u>, for the wind was against them, at about the fourth watch of the night He came to them, walking on the sea; and He intended <u>to pass by</u> them. ~ Mark 6:47-48 (NASB 1995)

**BASANIZO - GREEK** ~ to torture, torment, or be in severe distress

Who alone stretches out the heavens And tramples down the waves of the sea; ~ Job 9:8 (NASB 1995)

Your way was in the sea And Your paths in the mighty waters, And Your footprints may not be known. ~ Psalm 77:19 (NASB 1995)

PARERCHOMAI - GREEK ~ to pass by, to go past, to move alongside

But when they saw Him walking on the sea, they supposed that it was <u>a</u> <u>ghost</u>, and <u>cried out</u>; for they all saw Him and were <u>terrified</u>.

~ Mark 6:49-50a (NASB 1995)

ANAKRAZO - GREEK ~ to scream or shriek in alarm

<u>TARASSO - GREEK</u> ~ terrified, to be thrown into inner turmoil, shaken to the core

PHANTASMA - GREEK ~ an apparition, a vision, something unreal

But immediately He spoke with them and said to them, "<u>Take courage</u>; it is I, do not be afraid." ~ Mark 6:50b (NASB 1995)

**THARSEITE - GREEK** ~ be brave, be of good courage, or even be strengthened

**EGO EIMI - GREEK** ~ literally, "I AM"

ME PHOBEISTHE - GREEK ~ stop being afraid

Then He got into the boat with them, and the wind <u>stopped</u>; and they were <u>utterly astonished</u>, for they had not <u>gained any insight</u> from the incident of the loaves, but their heart was <u>hardened</u>. ~ Mark 6:51-52 (NASB 1995)

KOPAZO - GREEK ~ to grow weary, to tire out, to abate or become still

**EXISTANTO EK PERISSOU - GREEK** ~ overwhelmed beyond measure, almost beside themselves, utterly astonished

SYNIEMI - GREEK ~ to put the pieces together, to comprehend

<u>PEPOROMENE - GREEK</u> ~ from POROO, meaning calloused, dulled, resistant

<u>CHAZAQ - HEBREW</u> ~ to make firm, to strengthen

KABED - HEBREW ~ to make heavy, unyielding
